MOVING AHEAD

For the City of Struthers, 2023 represented considerable progress in the ongoing strategic planning for **Director** economic and environmental development in the city, and 2024 promises to be even better. **'Discover Struthers'**, the City's Comprehensive plan, prepared by KO Consulting, was completed, and adopted by City Council in October of 2023. **'Discover Struthers'** outlines the multipronged approach to stimulate economic and environmental development in the city improving the quality of life for its residents through riverfront development, utility infrastructure improvements and safe, accessible transportation. **'Discover Struthers'** can be read in its entirety at <u>www.cityofstruthers.com</u>

In June of 2023, the city was awarded a \$1,000,000 Transportation Grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation for a safety road redevelopment project on Bridge Street. The funds will be used to narrow streets, create bike lanes, and improve crosswalk markings to increase visibility for motorists. Pedestrian signals and accessible push buttons at signalized intersections are also part of the project plan along with curb ramp installations to meet Americans with Disabilities Act codes. Struthers also had two projects included in the Ohio Appalachian Community Grant program totaling \$156 million. The two projects are the Community River Launch and Downtown Streetscape and Revitalization. The decision for this will come in March. Read on to find out why I'm so excited about where Struthers is and what it can become. As we look ahead, the city will continue to pursue projects that will stimulate economic growth and quality of life for our residents.

Message from the Auditor - Christina Bohl



The financial department of the City of Struthers is comprised of an elected Treasurer and Auditor, and one full time and one part time clerical position. The Auditor and Treasurer work together but keep separate books to ensure accuracy in accounting and eliminate fraud of any kind. The Struthers General Fund is the city's largest unrestrictec

resource and funds most of the City's financial obligations. The General Fund budget for 2023 was Mark Brenner \$5,286,000. Currently, the city has twenty-six active Special Revenue Funds. These are restricted funds and are committed for a specific purpose, for example, street construction and maintenance. Struthers Wastewater Plant has an enterprise fund. These are funds used to account for fee-based activity used by external customers. Debt service funds are collected and committed to pay down accumulated principal and interest on debt. The 2024 Calander year will have a balanced budget and we will continue prudent spending to ensure financial stability.

City Façade Program

In 2023, in partnership with six Struthers businesses, the city assisted in funding façade grants for Kitts Heating and Cooling, Cigs for Less, Nemenz IGA, Spectrochemical Testing, Kurtz Tool and Die, and Youngstown Tool and Die. Facade work included exterior walls. landscaping, lighting, awnings, windows, doors, sidewalk repairs, and/ or, signage improvements. Some façades are completed while others will be done soon. The businesses provided the required match.







2021 American Rescue Plan Act and Downtown Revitalization

With funding provided through the Mahoning County Commissioners, the American Rescue Plan, and private owners, downtown revitalization is proceeding, in accordance with the Struthers Comprehensive Plan. Twelve grants have been awarded for building improvements. Those receiving grants were Donavitos, Selah, Geppetto's Costume, Cut-n-Toast, Dr. Andrews, Mr. Popovich, Mr. Heck, St. Anthony's Society and Kevin Walsh & Eric Rauschenbach. Some work has been completed, some soon to start. In addition, in 2024, two accessible outdoor gathering spaces are in the design stage and will be constructed at sites of the former Nick's Department Store and the foot of the 616 Bridge.

The Struthers Wastewater treatment plant is the second largest plant in Mahoning County, with a design capacity of six million gallons per day. The treatment plant currently treats over five million gallons of wastewater per day, removing approximately 500 tons of solids annually. There are five pump stations throughout the city. Plant personnel maintain 50 miles of sanitary sewer and over 300 stormwater catch basins. In addition to the city, the facility also treats wastewater from Poland and parts of Boardman township in Mahoning County. Our pretreatment program monitors discharges from a variety of industries and issues discharge permits, as required. When fully staffed plant personnel consist of one Plant Manager, one Assistant Plant Manager/Stormwater Manager, one lead operator, four Turn Operators, one Lead Maintenance man, one Assistant Maintenance man, five Utility Maintenance men, one Equipment Operator, one Chemist, one Industrial Monitor. The Struthers Water Pollution Control Improvement Project is one of only eight projects selected by Eastgate Regional Council of Governments to move forward to the Eastgate/Appalachian Regional Commission's Final Application, that the city submitted in December. Struthers is in the running to receive \$250,000 to upgrade equipment in its Water Pollution Control Facility. Awards will be announced in the spring. The Mahoning County Commissioners also funded a VACTOR sewer cleaning truck.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Stormwater Management is the process of controlling stormwater runoff that comes from impervious surfaces like parking lots driveways, and roofs. Effective stormwater management reduces the amount pollution by slowing and allowing the runoff to soak into the ground. Animal waste, pesticides oil, sediment and all end up in waterways and potentially in our sources of drinking water.



In July 2023, Struthers opened its new fire station which includes a state-of-the-art Marcs system that allows Struthers first responders to seamlessly communicate with each other and other agencies. Additionally, in 2023, Struthers was awarded \$123,000 in FEMA funding to purchase much needed safety equipment. With ARPA funds, the city was also able to purchase a 2022 fire truck to replace the 1997 fire truck.

STREET

Struthers was awarded a second \$1,265,000 grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation to replace the Wetmore Bridge over Yellow Creek. The city contributed \$260,000 towards the project. Construction to begin in the Spring of 2024.



POLICE

Struthers Police Department is comprised of a Chief of Police, four Captains, twelve fulltime Officers, six part-time Patrol Officials, four full-time Dispatchers, and an Administrative Assistant. Officers are assigned to various positions which include the Detective Bureau, Violent Crime Task Force, Drug Task Force, Marshall's Task Force, and other County units. The department is manned 24 hours a day with local dispatch, a full LEADS terminal and is one of the PSAP locations for Emergency 911. The Struthers Police Department currently utilizes nine marked police vehicles which include two K-9 vehicles. The cruisers are MD outfitted with radar units and specialty equipment. There are two unmarked vehicles and a police bicycle for special duties. School Resource Officers serve three public schools. They have become an asset when assisting students with their problems whether in school, or at home.
